

# *New Approach?*

Raleigh Baptist minister, the Rev. W. W. Finlator, said Sunday that instead of arresting students who attempt to eat at public restaurants, officers should be "padlocking these places that refuse to serve part of the public."

Mr. Finlator, pastor of Pullen Memorial Baptist Church, said in his sermon "They should be kept padlocked until they agree to serve all of the public.

"I'm not talking only about restaurants on the highways, but about those on Fayetteville Street and in Cameron Village," he continued.

The preacher referred to scandals at the national, state and local level. He said, "Another scandal is the story of sheriffs, deputies, policemen and justices of the peace arresting young students for the heinous crime of insisting upon being American citizens."
